Objectives of the KidSkate/CanSkate Program –

KidSkate is the Preschool Version of the national CanSkate Program.

CanSkate is Skate Canada's flagship learn-to-skate program, designed for beginners of all ages. The program focuses on fun, participation and basic skill development. Skaters will earn badges and other incentives as they learn fundamental skating skills. Lessons are given in a group format and led by an NCCP certified professional coach. Professional coaches are assisted by trained Program Assistants. The coach to student ratio is a maximum of 1:10. Skater's progress at their own rate and coaches make sessions active using teaching aids, music and a wide variety of activities that create a fun environment and promote learning. CanSkate is the feeder program to all other Skate Canada Skating Programs.

Skaters rules

All skaters must wear gloves or mittens at all times

Skaters in Stage 1, 2 or 3 Must wear a CSA Approved Hockey or skating Helmet. Bike Helmets do not protect against "skating" falls.

Skaters must wear their Colored nametags everyday. This helps to quickly identify which group the skater is in and also helps the coach know who the skater is when testing.

When a

skater passes a stage level they will receive a new colored nametag.

Stage & Colors are as follows:

Stage 1 – Red	Stage 2 – Blue	Stage 3 – Yellow
Stage 4 – Pink	Stage 5 – Green	Stage 6 – White

Please no long scarves or anything dangling around a skater's neck this poses a safety hazard.

Progress Reports

Will be handed out at the end of each session. The reports provide information to the skaters and parents about their skill progression and the types of skills each skater must be able to perform to advance to the next stage.
